To the Trustees of Middlebury College:

As the library enters on the final year of its enjoyment of Doctor Starr's gift, it seems fitting to speak of the increased efficiency in library work that has been made possible through this fund. It has been the policy of those in charge of the book-purchases to buy largely in the field of reference, and the library is far richer in carefully selected works of this sort than it was when the new building was entered. As a working collection it is constantly proving its worth in connection with the studies of the various departments, and if the same policy of purchase is continued the library should be an increasingly helpful factor in the college life. There are still many gaps, but progress has been steady.
